Inspireurope+ Leadership Roundtable, October 23, 2023, Thessaloniki, Greece





Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (AUTh) is pleased to organise a roundtable for university leaders on Monday October 23, 2023 in Thessaloniki, Greece. The roundtable will give university leadership (rectors, vice-rectors, international directors) the opportunity to exchange their experience and institutional approaches for supporting researchers at risk. It will also provide scope to discuss good practices and useful guidelines, as well as national and European approaches for supporting at riskresearchers. There is a particular focus on gathering university leaders from Southern and Eastern Europe for this roundtable, and institutions new to supporting researchers at risk will be particularly welcomed alongside institutions with greater experience in these supports whose representatives will share their experience. The annual Philipp Schwartz Initiative and Inspireurope+ Platform took place 23-24 May 2023 in Berlin. The programme included panels and exchanges on institutional, national, European and global initiatives to promote academic freedom and support scholars, and also provided informal networking opportunities for participants. There was wide participation in the forum from researchers at risk from around the world, especially those supported by the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation's Philipp Schwartz Initiative, as well as researchers from Ukraine, supported by MSCA4Ukraine. European and national government officials and other policymakers also participated, alongside representatives from NGOs, SAR sections, and higher education institutions across Europe. The European Commission opens call to pilot European fellowship scheme for researchers at risk

The Inspireurope+ project welcomes the European Commission's efforts towards a new EU fellowship scheme for researchers at risk. The Inspireurope <u>mapping report</u> showed a clear need for such a scheme, and the subsequent Inspireurope policy <u>recommendations report</u> provided further recommendations. A call for proposals to manage a small-scale pilot fellowship scheme is now open, with a deadline of September 7th for applications.

European University Association Call for contributions: Supporting Higher Education in Ukraine - #HE4UA initiative

The #HE4UA initiative "Supporting higher education in Ukraine: university responses to the war" aims at collecting and sharing information on support and collaboration measures targeted at Ukrainian higher education institutions and organisations. The European University Association (EUA) invites higher education institutions, organisations and networks, ministries, donor organisations and other actors, in Europe and beyond, to share through this <u>survey</u> information about their initiatives for supporting higher education in Ukraine. The initiative relates to <u>EUA's recommendations on Supporting the</u> Ukrainian university sector, which identified enhanced



collaboration and coordination as a key success factor for continued and enhanced support for the Ukraine's higher education sector.

Patrick Zaki pardoned, finally able to travel

In July, Inspireurope+ partners and higher education institutions in Italy and across Europe welcomed the news of the release of human rights researcher and University of Bologna student, Patrick Zaki. Zaki returned to Italy after over three years in Egypt, including twenty-two months in pre-trial detention in Egypt on charges of "spreading false news". On 23 July Zaki was presented with his Erasmus Mundus GEMMA Master's degree in Women and Gender Studies in person at the University of Bologna. University of Bologna Rector Giovanni Molari stated, "by history and by vocation the University is a place of freedom and pluralism, a place 'of the world' of which you Patrick are a citizen". The Inspireurope+ project partners remain deeply concerned for the many members of the higher education community still imprisoned in Egypt.

MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships Call Deadline 13 Sept. 2023

Asylum, Migration and Integration-based EU Funding Opportunities Available

The EU's <u>Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (AMIF)</u> programme has published calls for proposals for collaborative projects focused on supporting the effective integration and social inclusion of third country nationals and strengthening the common European asylum system. Any nonprofit organisation actively working to support migrant communities can apply for funding to deliver projects that address the AMIF programme's objectives and priorities.
