

- Main steps / draft a first Gantt Chart
- List of the partner(s) institution(s) + secondment (if relevant)



➤ Agree with all the information before starting the application work!

6/ MAKE THE DIFFERENCE

- Originality and innovative aspects of the planned research
- Novel concepts, approaches or methods
- Contribution to European excellence
- State of the art, and how the project will go beyond the state of the art
- Impact of the project (at several levels)
- Results of the projects (ambitious AND realistic)

7/ ORGANIZE YOUR PROJECT



Maximum 6 workpackages (WP = group of activities) :

2/3 scientific WP

These can run sequentially or concurrently and can be interconnected

1 WP for Management

Meetings with supervisor, standard reports to EU

1 WP for Training, Career Development and Transfer of Knowledge

Tasks/events (training, seminars, workshops...), job application, grant writing, career development plan

1 WP Dissemination/Exploitation, Communication/Public Engagement

Publications, conferences, wide-public outreach, press release

Major deliverables (= outputs)
Major milestones (= steps)
Secondment (if applicable)





The research problem is clearly described with appropriate references to the state-of-the-art of the field.

Individual objectives are clearly defined and align with the overall project goals, ensuring a structured approach to achieving the intended outcomes.

The new competences and skills that can be acquired during the fellowship are relevant to the researcher's profile

The Gantt chart is clear and coherent with planned activities per workpackage, including tasks, deliverables, secondments, training, dissemination and communication activities

The researcher convincingly demonstrates how the previous expertise will be reenforced during the fellowship.


